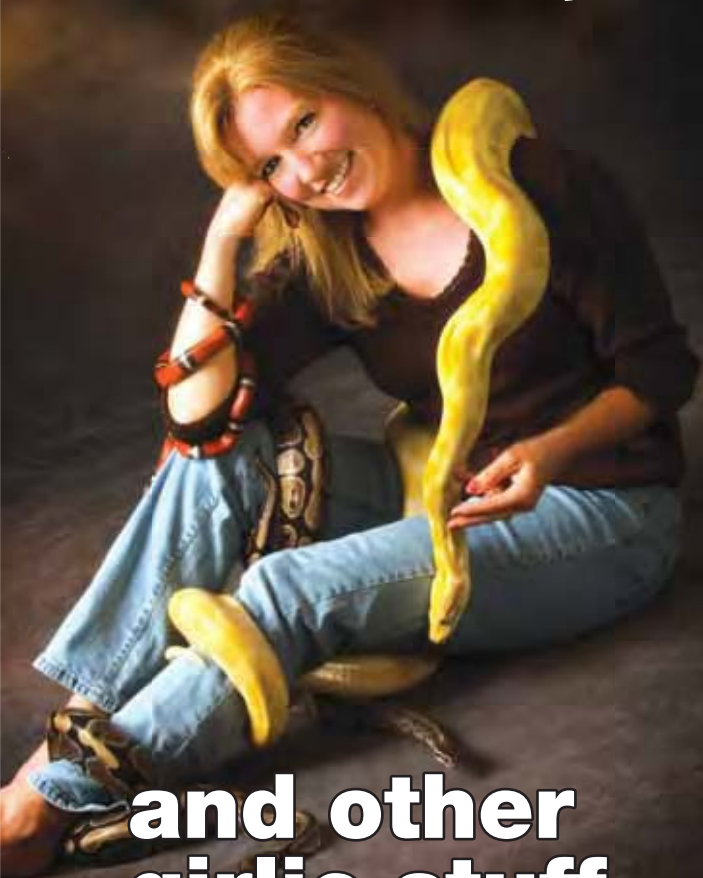

Central Bearded Dragon (*Pogona vitticeps*)



range: Australia

adult length: 18 – 22 inches

adult weight: 10 – 18 ounces

average lifespan: 4 – 10 years

habitat: Semi-arid forest, rocky desert

diet: Insects, plant matter

reproduction: 11 to 16 eggs laid in shallow nest dug in the sand then left unattended. Eggs incubate about 3 months

did you know? The bearded dragon's name comes from Specialized scales along the throat, neck, and head which the lizard will puff out when feeling threatened. These spiny throat projections appear similar to a human beard.

Burmese Python (*Python molarus bivittatus*)



range: South Asia

adult length: 13 – 20 feet

adult weight: 170 – 200 pounds

average lifespan: 4 – 20 years

habitat: Grassland to "open jungle"

diet: Rabbits, mice, rats, amphibians, lizards, other snakes, birds, and other mammals

reproduction: 20 to 100 eggs laid in the early spring.

Mother pythons won't eat for the 55 to 75 days it takes their eggs to hatch.

did you know? The female python is the only snake that can raise its own body temperature. While keeping their eggs warm mothers will "tremble" their muscles to increase the temperature around the eggs.

African Spurred Tortoise (*Geochelone sulcata*)



range: South Saharan Africa

adult length: 24 – 30 inches

adult weight: 80 – 110 pounds

average lifespan: 40 – 80 years

habitat: Desert and semi-desert

diet: Dry grasses, lettuce, berseem, and morning-glory leaves

reproduction: 15 to 30 eggs laid in a large, shallow nest. Eggs are covered with sand and left to incubate about 8 months

did you know? Succulent plants provide Spurred Tortoises with their water, and they coat their skin with mud to cool off. Their burrows are up to 30 feet long and often provide shelter for other animals. Some African cultures regard the Spurred Tortoise as a mediator between men and the gods.

African Pygmy Hedgehog (*Atelerix albiventris*)



range: Central Africa

adult length: 7 – 9 inches

adult weight: 10 – 18 ounces

average lifespan: 2 – 3 years in the wild; 8 – 10 years in captivity

habitat: Scrub forest, desert

diet: Spiders and insects, plant matter, small vertebrates

reproduction: 5 or 6 young are born live in about 35 days.

did you know? Hedgehogs are fairly vocal, and communicate not in a series of grunts and snuffles.

Emperor Scorpion (*Pandinus imperator*)



range: West African Coast

adult length: 4 – 6.5 inches

adult weight: .8 – 1.1 ounces

average lifespan: 5 – 8 years

habitat: Burrow in hot, humid rain forest

diet: Insects, other scorpions

reproduction: 7 to 9 month gestation yields up to 35 live-born young.

did you know? Despite its fearsome appearance the Emperor Scorpion's sting is no more venomous than a honeybee's.
